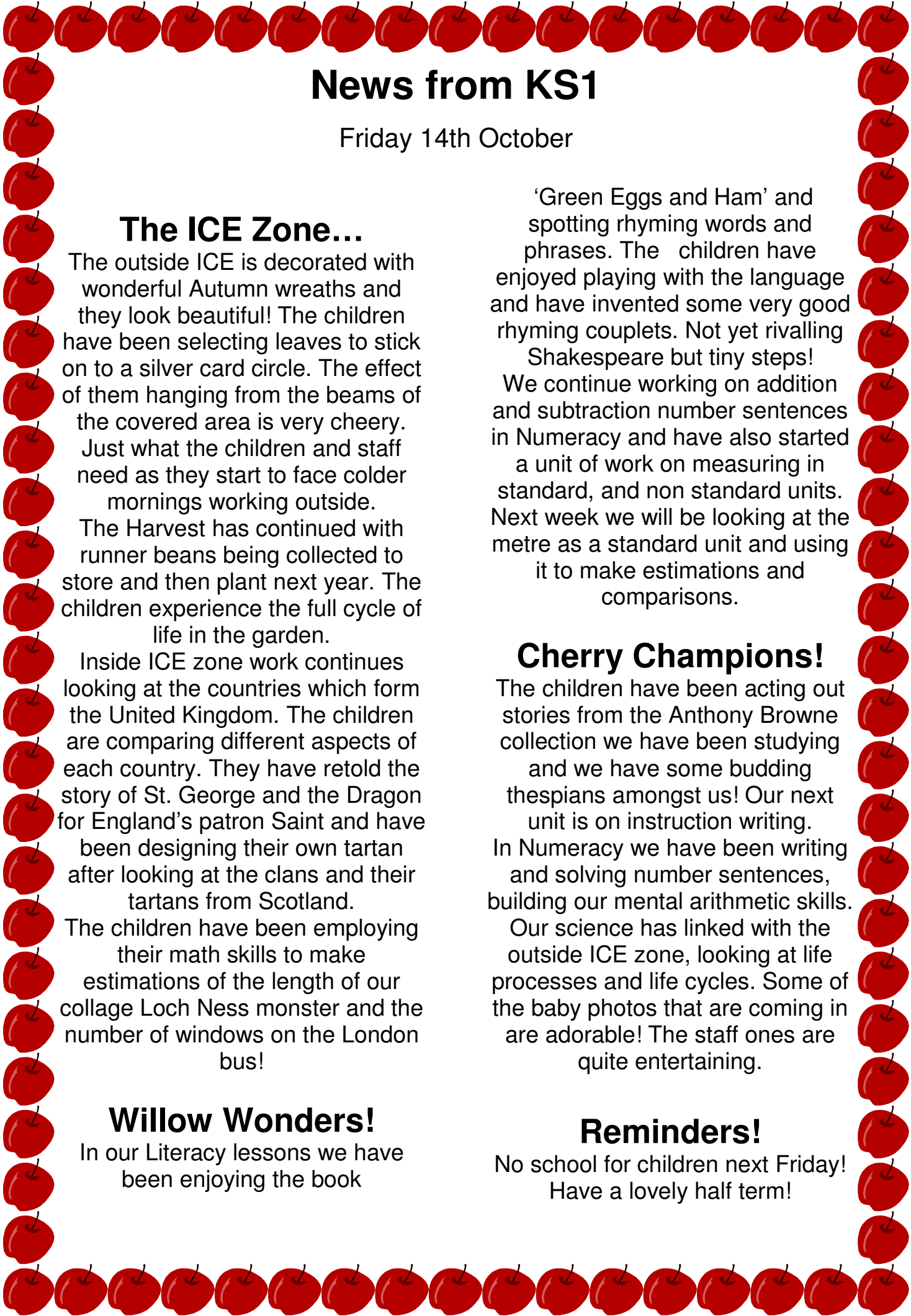




News from KS1

The ICE Zone...

The outside ICE is decorated with wonderful Autumn wreaths and they look beautiful! The children have been selecting leaves to stick on to a silver card circle. The effect of them hanging from the beams of the covered area is very cheery.

Just what the children and staff need as they start to face colder mornings working outside.

The Harvest has continued with runner beans being collected to store and then plant next year. The children experience the full cycle of life in the garden.

Inside ICE zone work continues looking at the countries which form the United Kingdom. The children are comparing different aspects of each country. They have retold the story of St. George and the Dragon for England's patron Saint and have been designing their own tartan after looking at the clans and their tartans from Scotland.

The children have been employing their math skills to make estimations of the length of our collage Loch Ness monster and the number of windows on the London bus!

In our Literacy lessons we have been enjoying the book

'Green Eggs and Ham' and spotting rhyming words and phrases. The children have enjoyed playing with the language and have invented some very good rhyming couplets. Not yet rivalling Shakespeare but tiny steps!

We continue working on addition and subtraction number sentences in Numeracy and have also started a unit of work on measuring in standard, and non standard units. Next week we will be looking at the metre as a standard unit and using it to make estimations and comparisons.

In Numeracy we have been writing and solving number sentences, building our mental arithmetic skills.
