ICE Zone...

On display in the ICE zone are pop up puppets designed and made by Year 1 and marionette puppets designed and made by Year 2- feel free to pop in and take a look.

The children have been learning about the British Isles, labelling maps and studying where the coastal regions are. All the children had time with Mrs Suali last week learning about Sikhism. This included role play, singing and learning to speak Punjabi.



Willow Wonders!

The children have continued writing 'Seaside Poetry'. They have written an acrostic poem, an alliteration poem, a comparison poem and a story poem. They are becoming really good at using adjectives!

In maths, we have been using fractions within problem solving – great work is being achieved with halves and quarters.

The children have set up an experiment in Science to find out what seeds need to grow. They are regularly recording the results and are very keen each morning to see what has happened.

Cherry Champions!

All of the Key Stage 1 statutory assessments are now completed and hopefully the children will have been barely aware of what was happening! They all coped very well and performed their best. We are very proud of them. In the classroom we have been looking at lifecycles in Science and the children have been writing non-fiction texts related to this, organising their writing under subheadings. They have continued their factual writing with information they gained from the visit from Mrs Suali. In Numeracy the children continue their numeracy skills and are relating these to real life situations by buying picnic items from Mrs Grinling's kitchen and totalling the price of their hamper. We have found different ways of paying with coin equivalents and finally worked on some 2 step problems where the children had to find change from a £1 coin. (Mrs Grinling has very cheap produce!).
