The ICE Zone...

Fantastic work has been taking place connected to The Great Fire of London in the ICE zone. The children have been using computers and ipads to find information and answer questions. A Pudding Lane bakery has been set up for shopping role play, applying Numeracy skills the children have learnt in class.

Our resident artist, Mr Cornell has been busy working with us looking at London themed art work. He has introduced the children to pieces by Claude Monet and they are trying impressionist brush stroke techniques for themselves.

The children have been busy partitioning in Numeracy. They have used these skills within Money and are now moving on to multiplication and division.

Our Literacy genre is Poetry, looking at rhythm and pattern. The children have recited poems and added their own actions.



They will continue working on poems and eventually write and perform their own.

Our Science topic is Materials. The children have started to sort objects by their materials and have come up with great words to describe certain materials.
